



- 1) The use of face mask will be mandatory in any indoor activity or when the distance between different Kvutzot cannot be guaranteed, as well as during transportation and field trips in general. During outdoor activities where each Kvutza is separated, the use of face mask will be optional. This measure applies to anyone, regardless of vaccination status.
- 2) Most of the activities will take place outside. During indoor activities, the use of face mask is mandatory for everyone.
- 3) The distance between Kvutzot during all activities, even with the use of face mask, will be encouraged.
- 4) The activities will be carried out in stable groups, determined by the generation or Kvutza of each participant, minimizing the interaction between groups.
- 5) Hand washing protocols will be enforced during activities, especially before and after lunch time.
- 6) All participants and staff must be aware of any Covid-19 symptoms that may occur, and must be reported immediately and refrain from participating in activities in case of suspicion.
- 7) Temperature and symptoms of all participants will be monitored prior to the start of activities and randomly during the day.
- 8) Any participant or staff who has traveled outside the country will not be able to participate in the activities until 10 days after their return, unless a negative test is carried out 3-4 days after their return, which will allow them to return to the activities 7 days after.
- 9) Any participant who has been in close contact with someone diagnosed with Covid-19 must remain in quarantine for 14 days and will not be able to participate in the activities for 2 weeks from the last day of contact.
- 10) Any positive case (proven or assumed) of Covid-19 must be isolated and immediately reported to the Covid-19 committee for follow/up: [covid@kenjc.org](mailto:covid@kenjc.org)

\*People who have recovered from Covid-19 and have already received medical discharge, as well as those who have completed the vaccination process (two weeks after receiving all doses), do not need to comply with the quarantine periods (trip or “close contact”) or testing for up to 90 days from the start of the case, as long as they remain symptom-free at all times.
